Despite the fact, this spring it has the chance to witness something which may be marked as an expression of a sustainable care of family heritage in future. Johan Kräftner, the long-serving director of the Princely Art Collections, who kindly gave a lecture that many of our members surely remember, started his well-deserved retirement. Of course, this unique art collection, unrivalled in the world, was not left abandoned. The princely family established Stephan Koja, an outstanding figure in global art gallery business, as its new head. Since 2016, this born Austrian worked as the head of the Old Master Gallery in Dresden and before that as a curator in Belvedere, Vienna. I am pleased that continuity is also a word characterizing the Lednice-Valtice Music Festival which its founder, and our member, Jiří Partyka has been leading already into its eighth year. This year's programme will be devoted to young



performers under 25 years, which is, in a way, also a sign of sustainability (in music world). The more pleased I am that after Vienna, one of the festival concerts will also take place in Prague, particularly in the Liechtenstein Palace.

Finally, the continuity of our efforts has been recently proven by the General Assembly of the Czech-

Liechtenstein Society which, thanks to the assistance by Richard Svoboda, the Valtice Castle Manager, was held in the local, beautifully renovated venue of Belveder. I am looking forward to fulfilling together our association's programme and I am wishing you a nice spring! ■

Bronzes Exhibition in the Garden Palace in Vienna

Yet another spring exhibition, as part of the 'March in Palace' event, was held at the Garden palace in Vienna during the first spring month. Called '*Cast Forever - Princes of Liechtenstein's Bronzes*', it offered its visitors to admire view and valuable a collection of bronze statues.

Art pieces cast in bronze, an alloy of copper and tin, have always been amongst the greatest masterpieces of the humankind. The collections of Liechtenstein's Prince boast the most valuable bronze statues dating from the 15th till the 19th centuries.

Among the remarkable bronzes exhibited in Vienna are for instance the 'Bust of Markus Aurelius' by Anticov, 'Bust of

Anima Dannata' by Massimiliano Soldani-Benzi and 'Bust of Ferdinando I de' Medici' by Pieter Taccy. The gems of the Liechtenstein collections were also complemented by art pieces loaned from various remarkable bronzes collections, such as an 'Equestrian statue' by Leonardo da Vinci. **The exhibition was held in the Garden palace on Fürsten**gasse, March 1-31, 2023. ■

Princely family will visit Opava in May at the occasion ofa vernissage of an exhibition about the Liechtenstein family held in a local museum

Opava and Krnov are to experience a prestigious diplomatic event this May. A vernissage held on Wednesday, May 24, 2023, at 5 pm, will open a remarkable exhibition held in the Silesian municipal museum in Opava, at the occasion of the jubilee of Prince Karl the I. of Liechtenstein acquiring the Opava princedom. The exhibition will map out the 400 years



history of the Liechtensteins in the neighbouring Krnov region. Members of the Liechtenstein family are not going to miss this event and will visit Opava to see the opening of the exhibition in the historical building of the museum.

Princess *Nora of Liechtenstein*, the sister of the current head of the family, prince *Hans Adam II.*, and chairman of the family council, prince *Alfred of Liechtenstein*, have promised to attend the event. *Maria-Pia Kothbauer*, the Ambassador of the Principality of Liechtenstein to the Czech Republic and Austria and the cousin of Hans Adam II., will also join the delegation from Vaduz. According to the words of Prince Hans Adam II., he has very much become fond of Opava during his two recent visits to the city.

The exhibition will present historical importance of the family with regards to the unification and development of the region during the pre-modern period, and it will also introduce the role of the rulers of the family and their influence on self-government of the area. Untraditionally, the attention will also be paid to the economic and administrative activities in forestry and mining activities, which the Liechtensteins carried out as part of their possession and ruling of Opava and Krnov princedoms. Visitors will also learn about centres of administration of Liechtenstein's princes, i.e., Opava and Krnov chateaus, and about the local aristocrats. Furthermore, the exhibition will focus on the consolidation of religious affairs in the region following the Thirty Years' War, re--catholicisation and baroque culture development, with the emphasis on establishment of the Jesuit scholasticate in Opava. The role of the Liechtensteins in the moder era will also be presented, such as their support of various associations and other activities of the civil society that is being born.

Liechtenstein archive and museum are also participating in the exhibition and will present a number of unique objects. As for the Czech national institutions, for instance provincial Archive in Opava, National regional archive Opava, Museum of Šumperk region, Technical museum Brno, Moravian gallery Brno, State National heritage institution and Český Krumlov chateau are also participating.

A number of alternative lectures are also to be part of the exhibition as well as a catalogue, which will be published at the anniversary of Prince Karl I. of Liechtenstein's acquisition of Opava princedom next January.

17 January 2023 - The Liechtenstein family company Kaiser was founded in 1913 and this year it will celebrate 10 years of its existence. The company has gradually developed into an international industrial enterprise with sites in Liechtenstein, Austria, Italy, Finland, the USA and Slovakia. According to the owners, the company's success story is based on constant innovation and new inventions. Its main products include municipal equipment sewage cleaning and industrial disposal vehicles, pumps and their components, tracked excavators and mobile walking excavators. Its vehicles are currently in use on five continents, in 116 countries and some 1,000 cities.



16 February 2023 - In the Princely collections of Liechtenstein we can also find this painting by the German painter and lithographer Franz Xaver Winterhalter (1805-1873). He was inspired by a set of novellas about love called The Decameron by the Italian Renaissance poet and novelist Giovanni Boccaccio. One hundred novellas, divided into ten days, are told by a group of seven young women and three young men who flee the city for the countryside to save themselves from a plague that breaks out in Florence in the mid-14th century. The work was acquired for a private art collection in 2009 by the current ruler of Liechtenstein, Hans-Adam II. The painting is on display as part of a permanent presentation at the Liechtenstein City Palace in Vienna. ■
